Scientific research highlights that the climate is variable and undergoes changes over time. Communities, agriculture, industry, economic activities and the environment are all sensitive to variations and fluctuations in the climate. In the future these variations may be more pronounced and require different institutional mechanisms. The Institutional Adaptations to Climate Change (IACC) project is a multidisciplinary research initiative focused on rural community vulnerabilities to climate and water-related stresses in the South Saskatchewan River Basin and the capacities of governance institutions to reduce community vulnerability.
